Micro-credentials are short, flexible and accredited learning experiences that empower professionals to gain industry-relevant skills.

Is it for me?

This micro-credential will be relevant to registered nurses working either in the hospital or community setting who care for patients with cardiac conditions or those who are at risk of developing cardiovascular disease.

What does it cover?

The micro-credential will equip learners with the skills and knowledge required to aid patients/service users in self-management of their cardiac chronic disease. It will cover a range of core concepts; from health promotion and disease prevention to disease diagnosis, treatment, and management. Specific skills such as motivational interviewing, action plan initiation and knowledge of the pathophysiology of cardiovascular diseases will be covered.

How is it delivered?

This micro-credential will be delivered in a blended format. To ensure flexibility synchronous and asynchronous learning will be provided through the use of multimedia in the form of videos, written materials, podcasts, as well as interactive tools such as polling, and discussion boards. To allow for increased flexibility in learning, live classes will be recorded for learners to watch after the session.
